
We are grateful to those who support us in our mission, and with their help, we have completed many projects this year. Some of the highlights include:





MEMBERSHIP BY YEAR




MEMBERSHIP BY GEOGRAPHY*






MEMBERSHIP BY TYPE*

MEMBERSHIP BY AGE GROUP*






CERTIFICATION BY TYPE

GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS REPORT

ADVOCACY (LEGISLATIVE, REGULATORY AND JUDICIAL):

- ▶ Joined the American Petroleum Institute to deliver a letter to Congress to oppose a proposed methane fee on producers.
- ► Facilitated AAPL letter campaign with other trade groups to successfully convince the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission to adjust their regulatory review process of burdensome greenhouse gas emissions corporate reporting.
- ► Delivered multiple AAPL president's letters to President Biden, the U.S. Department of the Interior, the U.S. Secretary of State, and the U.S. Department of Energy regarding federal leasing and permitting policies to support and increase traditional domestic energy production.
- Supported successful passage of Louisiana bill, HB 705, that reduces penalties for companies who misclassify workers as independent contractors, provides a multi-factor test to determine worker status, and removes the presumption that workers are employees.

- ► Coordinated advocacy efforts with the Professional Certification Coalition to advance legislation that would benefit members in seeking certifications and protecting our members' right to work.
- Provided members with critical regulatory updates and opportunities to comment on proposed rulemaking from the California Air Resources Board, Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission, New Mexico Environment Department, Texas Railroad Commission.
- ► Reviewed multiple amicus brief requests for AAPL intervention in cases involving lease disputes, royalty claims, and employee misclassification.
- ► Published governmental affairs reports and bill tracking summaries exclusively for members on monitored legislative, regulatory, and judicial matters.
